

Good Day Voyageurs Militaire,

Welcome to 2019!!! As of the last membership report for 2018, La Societe started the year with 7,941 Voyageurs who, constitutionally, are not permitted to attend Promenades at any level.

As of today, January 4th, 2019, Voiture Nationale has processed 510 renewals and/or new members. This leaves Nationale 6,938 renewals and/or new members short of our 22,300 goal.

Now is the time for the leaders of all Grandes, and Locales, to step up, and contact as many of your Voyageurs, who have not paid their dues for 2019, as you can. As I review the membership of each Grande, I see numerous Voitures Locales that have not submitted any memberships this year. My question to the Grande Chefs and Voiture Locale Chefs is "What are you doing to rectify this issue of nonpayment?" Why is this non-payment issue happening?

I am also asking each Grande Chef to contact all Voiture Locale Chefs in their Grandes to encourage them to contact all Voyageurs that have not paid their 2019 dues. Encourage them to re-commit to La Societe.

To all of the leaders of La Societe, if you are not placing Recruiting of New Members and the Retention of Current Members as your number 1 and number 2 priorities, then I am asking you to place them in the number 1 and number 2 spots.

Good Day Voyageurs Militaire,

This will be my last letter for 2018. As of our last membership report for 2018, La Societe will have 7,941 Voyageurs who, constitutionally, will not be permitted to attend Promenades at any level. I have enclosed a copy of Article V, section 13, for your perusal. Should you have any questions about this issue, feel free to contact me for discussion.

As it stands right now, La Societe will have 7,941 Voyageurs go into a delinquent member status. So my question to you, the leaders of La Societe is, are your dues paid?

The membership goal is	22,300
Total paid memberships for 2019	-14,359
Total short of goal	7,941
Total new Members for 2019	
Total needed for 100%	7,447

Some of you are wondering about my math skills...so let us review the numbers. We need 22,300 paid membership, either renewal or new to meet our goal of 22,300. We have received 14,359 renewals from current Voyageurs (including PLMs). When you subtract the 14,359 current paid Voyageurs from the goal of 22,300, you see that we need 7,941 current Voyageurs to pay their dues. Now, subtract the 494 new members from the 7,941 Voyageurs needed, you get the number of 7,447 renewals and/or new members to reach our goal of 22,300.

Now is the time for the leaders of all Grandes, and Locales, to step up,, and contact as many of your Voyageurs, who have not paid their dues for 2019, as you can. As I review the membership of each Grande, I see numerous Voitures Locales that have not submitted any memberships this year. My question to the Grande Chefs and Voiture Locale Chefs is "What are you doing to rectify this issue of nonpayment?" Why is this non-payment issue happening?

Constitution of La Societe des 40 Hommes et 8 Chevaux Article V Membership and Dues

Section 13. PENATIES FOR NON-PAYMENT OF DUES. Any member who shall fail to pay their dues for the current year on or before December 31 shall not be permitted to attend any Promenade until such dues have been have been paid; and any member who shall be in arrears one year in the payment f their dues shall stand suspended and notice to that effect shall be given to them by the Correspondant of their Voiture Locale by certified mail, addressed to their last place of residence; and if they shall fail to pay their dues within one month from the date of the mailing of and notice to pay the arrears, and such reinstatement fees as may be required by the Grande Voiture and Voiture Locale, they shall stand expelled and may not be readmitted to membership except upon nomination in accordance with Section 6 of this article.

How to deal with the older, non-participating, Voyageur

Every Voiture Locale has members who are older and no longer participating in Voiture Activities. At some point in time these older Voyageurs will stop paying their dues. Some will feel they have been abandoned by their Voiture Locale, some are in assisted living facilities and some are in a nursing home. The question is "How do we handle these situations?"

Recently, I made calls correspondents of Voiture Locales that have unpaid members for 2018. What I found interesting when I questioned these correspondents about these unpaid members the correspondents, for the most part, had no idea who some members are. Several correspondents said it was not their job to keep track of delinquent members. One Correspondant told me that the Voyageur that had not paid his dues for 2018 was in a nursing home. When I suggest that maybe the voyageurs of that Voiture Locale could take a collection to pay his dues, I was told quite emphatically that it was not their (the Voyageurs of that Locale) responsibility to pay anyone's dues. That, fortunately, is not the case in all Locales.

So how should we as Voyageurs handle this situation? We are ALL veterans and we ALL have been taught by the military to look after, and to take care of, our battle buddies. So here are my suggestions:

Establish a visitation committee to visit the older Voyageurs

Establish a program to raise funds to assisted Voyageurs in assisted living facilities and nursing homes to pay their dues.

Offer home bound Voyageurs a ride to promenades and 40 and 8 activities.

Seek their ideas on Voyageur activities.

I know that these ideas are contrary to what some Voiture Locales believe. It is my personal belief that we have a duty, and an obligation, to look after and help our older Voyageurs. The fourth point of the Warrior Ethos that I learned states "I will never leave a fallen comrade." I strongly believe that this point applies to this situation. The question now is "Are you leaving your older Voyageurs behind?"

Excerpts from Joseph Story Nationale Directeur--Membership

Membership Eligibility

Let's take a moment to look at the eligibility requirements:

In accordance with the Constitution of La Societe des 40 Hommes et 8 Chevaux, Article IV, section 1, "WHO MAY BECOME MEMBERS. No persons, other than honorably discharged U.S. military personnel, and active duty U. S. military, may become members of La Societe des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chevaux. No Grande Voiture, or Voiture Locale, may prescribe, or establish, any eligibility qualifications for membership in La Societe which are in conflict with the Constitution of Voiture Nationale."

Article IV is quite explicit about who can be a member. There are no if, ands or buts about it. You cannot discriminate based upon gender or race. Also, did you notice there is no requirement to be a member of the American Legion? Also, there are no service periods that you must have served during to be eligible for membership.

Article V, section 1 forbids Honorary Membership in La Societe. You are either eligible or you're not. Period! Section 6 of Article V describes the requirements for nomination for membership. This section outlines, in detail, requirements for membership.

What I am asking of you is, that we as the leaders of La Societe, read the Constitution of La Societe 40 Hommes et 8 Chevaux especially Articles 1 through 5 and then make absolutely sure that our members know, and understand, the eligibility requirements for membership.

MEMBERSHIP

How to involve new members in your Voiture

Now that you have invited, and initiated, the new member, the question becomes "How do we get the new Voyageur involved in Voiture Activities?" To answer that question let's take trip back in time...to 1976 when a young soldier was invited to be become a member of the 40 and 8 he went before a membership review board. Questions that he was asked had to do with my community service, what activities that I thought I would like to volunteer to help with and why I wanted to be a Forty and Eight. Of the five of us that were interviewed that day 3 of us were accepted into the 40 and 8.

Please understand that I am not suggesting we go back to membership review boards, but I am suggesting that the leadership of the Voiture Locale discuss the programs of the 40 and 8 with the new member. I am also suggesting that we mentor the new member. So, if the new member likes the idea of volunteering to help with Flags for First Graders then the chairperson of that committee should take the new member under their wing and explain to them what is expected of a volunteer. The worst thing that we can do is take that new member and put them in charge of a program that they unfamiliar with. This may work sometimes, but most of the time it will not and you will generally lose this member through non-payment of dues.

Voiture 567 honors the lives and passing of two of its prominent members.

Tommie Fordham was taken from this life October 25th in a motorcycle accident while riding the "Dragon's Tail" with the Legion Riders. Tommie was a Chef de Gare Locale Passe, Grand Chef de Gare du Georgia Passe, and a Past Commander of American Legion Post 135. He was also serving as Drapeau National and Cheminot National at the time of his death.

Michael Jones was called home December 13th. Michael was serving as the Grand Sous Director for Nurses Training and was a long time Service Officer for the Voiture and American Legion Post 135. He was known throughout the community as the person to go to whenever a veteran needed assistance and never failed to respond to the phrase "Aidez moi!"

How would your Voiture like to earn money to support your projects during the year?

Voiture 567 has had a four year project of selling fire works during the 4th of July time period. During that period they have averaged between \$5500 and \$6000 for about two and half weeks effort, and with little or no capital outlay on their part.

These dollars go to their Nurse Scholarship Program and the building of our train.

The company furnishes a fully stocked store, fire inspections, licensing, a rent free and expense free operation. Your total obligation is to man the store, set up for operation and sell, sell. A percentage of the profits goes to the selling organization.

The Fireworks Company will assist in setting up credit card charge accounts and train the personnel how to use it. Additionally the company provides a comprehensive training program that covers all aspects of training for the manager and the operating personnel. There are Computer driven classes to be used for review by the managers and operators, in case of questions that arise during the course of the sales. Further, the Company is only a phone call away during hours of operation.

Over the past four years I have developed a series of SOP's to assist managers in setting up and operating your shop, including schedules and guidelines that I would be happy to provide to you if you decide to try this endeavor. Greetings Central Region Child Welfare program.

I must apologize for possibly misleading you last month about the reimbursement funds obtained from the Ardery Child Welfare Fund. I was also at the time assisting veterans with the Legions National Emergency Fund (NEF) after we had a devastating hurricane pass through south Georgia. Joe was quick to correct me in the advice I provided. I then realized that I had a senior moment when I wrote that letter, sorry if I confused anyone.

The fund will reimburse Locale's and Grand's for expenditures up to \$300 per child under 17 years of age to replace necessary clothing and personal hygiene items when a family has lost their possessions due to fire, flood or other disaster. This is after any other agency such as Red Cross has not responded in a timely manner. Locales should assist those affected in getting help from local agencies as soon as they are aware of the situation. Should those agencies not respond and the situation for the effected family is critical, then they should step in and help and then apply to National for reimbursement.

If you need the Child Welfare report forms the can be found at the Petite Communiqué on the Forty and Eight home page. Keep in mind that .25 of each dues paid by a voyager is for the C W Program. Be sure to include this number in your report. Let's start 2019 with a bang by the Grand's ordering the CW pins and distributing them at your Mid-Winter. Also Joe Donovan is ordering the polo shirts for the Grand Directors and locale directors that want them. They are not free so be prepared to pay a small price for them. It should be considered an honor to be named a Director of your Grande or Locale.





The Perfect 40 & 8 Public Relations story for 2019

It will be 70 years in February of 2019

In 1947, a Friendship Train carried \$40 million in relief supplies to France and Italy. The 700-car train was the brainchild of Drew Pearson, an American newspaper columnist. As the little train moved across the country, its popularity and notoriety skyrocketed. By the time it reached New York, it was actually three trains coming in from all different directions. Once in New York, the food was unloaded and sent by ship -- with ample notice where it was coming from -- to France and Italy.

A French veteran and railroad worker named Andre Picard stated a movement to send surplus WWI era boxcars to the US filled with tokens of appreciation from the people of France to the people of America. In all, 49 boxcars would be sent -- each packed with mementos from French citizens of every age and class.

Each state would receive a boxcar. One would be split between Washington, DC and the territory of Hawaii. The boxcars were of an especially appropriate type -- known as the 40 et 8 -- 'suitable' for 40 men or 8 horses. These small boxcars had transported thousands of American Gls during the wars; each cramped, bumpy ride leaving a lasting impression on the passengers. Each boxcar was decorated with a painted 'Gratitude Train' ribbon and with 40 coat-of-arms representing the provinces of France.

The French boxcars arrived in New York Harbor aboard the ship Magellan in February 1949. The ship was met by waves of aircraft and a flotilla of boats. With 'Merci, America' painted across its hull, it was docked and unloaded. New York's boxcar was paraded through Manhattan. The other boxcars were loaded onto flatcars (their wide wheel axles not compatible with our track width) and sent off to the far reaches of the nation.

Each state had a reception waiting for their boxcar. Several states sent their boxcars on tours of the state so everyone could see the car and its contents. They came to rest permanently in municipal parks, railroad museums, fairgrounds, and Veterans Posts. Most survive to this day. My suggestion is this:

Go to http://www.mercitrain.org/ and find if your state still has its train and where it is located. Plan a statewide visit to the train in February to honor the WWI & WWII veterans that prompted the events leading up to the Friendship and Merci trains. Invite all voyagers from across the state. Take pictures and send them to voiturenational@msn.com our Forty & Eighter official publication. Send pictures and a story to your local newspaper or even better contact them to show up at your celebration. Sous Directeur Public Relations
